Grade 7

- Track and Field is this Friday, June 3.
- ELA** – Students continue to read and work on activities for *Banner in the Sky*.
- MATH** - There is a unit test on Circles (chapter 8 in the textbook) on Thursday June 2nd. Lesson notes are posted in the 7 Math Google Classroom. This unit includes being able to draw circles of various diameters using a compass, as well as determining a circle's circumference and area (using appropriate formulas) and constructing circle graphs (pie charts). Workbook assignments 8.1-8.5 are all due, as well as a Pie Chart assignment on Google Sheets.
- SCIENCE** - We have spent a lot of time learning about rock types and the rock cycle, including hearing from retired Geology professor Michael Issigonis who shared some of his wealth of knowledge on the topic, as well as many samples of rocks and minerals. (Michael Issigonis was also one of the volunteer judges at our local Science Fair at CHS earlier this year). There is an assignment on the Rock Cycle due at the end of this week.
- BIBLE** - The next memory verses are Titus 2:11-12. The test will be on Tuesday, June 7.
- S.S.** - We have completed our unit on Africa. Next, we will study South America.
- français – Students are working on memorizing a role for the play *Salut, Mon Ami*.
